- b. Raine Hambly reported that the CTE department would be submitting approximately four programs: Entrepreneurship, Human Resources, Google IT, and Amazon Web Services. The Entrepreneurship program is scheduled for review at December's Orange County Regional Consortium meeting, with updates incorporating feedback from the advisory committee. The Human Resource Assistant and Good IT programs may also go through revisions following

feedback from advisory groups. Furthermore, there is a possibility of introducing a new Amazon Web Services program.
